NetballSmart

Representative teams NetballSmart workshops

As the rep netball season is kicking into gear NetballSmart has been visiting each team across the Zone to prepare them for their upcoming tournaments. The workshops focused on what it looks like to be a good athlete both off and on the court. The key focus areas were around correct hydration and nutrition, and the effect poor nutrition and hydration can have on the athlete's performance. As little as 5% in reduction in total body water can decrease performance by up to 30%. The U18 teams had an analysis of their warm-up to ensure they were meeting the physiological demands of netball and were confident with the correct movement patterns. NetballSmart then attend the Netball North Harbour representative tournament and it was great to see the teams implementing the feedback they had been giving at the workshops. It was great to have some informal conversations with coaches, managers, and parents about NetballSmart and how they can support their athletes. Good Luck to all the teams attending Envirowaste North Island Junior Netball Championships and the Celebration Box U18 Champs!

NetballSmart will be running AIMS workshops in August for teams attending AIMS workshops please look out for the dates these will be held. They will be held at Netball Centres and cover the NetballSmart Power warm-up as well as tournament tips for players.

The ideal Community Coach will:

- Nurture a love of Netball
- Coach in a Player-Centred approach
- Growth Mindset
- Focus on skill development, decision making and a nonlinear approach to skill development
- Reinforce ethical approaches to sport and recreation
- Understand they're in the business of creating not only better players, but better people
- Have a sense of working in a wider coaching community with similar goals

CCA Level 1 award requires the coach to complete the Sport Tutor online modules as well as the practical components at a workshop. The modules include Attack, Defence, Building Effective Relationships, Selecting, Skills Analysis, Shooting, Team Culture, Planning, Learning to Umpire and Netball Smart Module.
