# NETBALL SUCCESS THANKS TO JUNIOR PLAYERS TAMAKI MAKAURAU FUND

Congratulations to all our netball clubs and Centres who were successful with their applications to the Junior Players Tamaki Makaurau Fund. The fund was truly over-subscribed with a total of 149 applications across 30 codes requesting more than \$2 million. We celebrate the 51 organisations that received financial support that will impact around 10,000 participants across Auckland. The full list of recipients can be found on Aktives Website <u>Funding</u> <u>Aktive – Auckland Sport & Recreation - Aktive</u>. Netball received a total of \$87,720 being 16% of the total funds available.

Netball Waitakere's funds are directed to lower demographic schools and clubs with children who would otherwise not be able to participate. Their funds are being used to purchase netballs and shoes ensuring these children can enjoy being active in netball.
