Board Induction

Following our Zone AGM where Sulu Fitzpatrick and Anna Richard were elected to the Netball Northern Zone board, we have also welcomed three new co-opted board members to our board team. Our new board members are:

A key step to ensure our new board members get up to speed quickly is a good induction process, which we commenced this week.

Our board charter describes induction as a combination of reading, discussions and experience on the job, as follows:

- Upon joining the board and prior to the first board meeting provide: Board Charter, Constitution, governance or board approved policies, Netball NZ and Zone strategy, last three meeting papers, latest financial reports, organisation chart, key contacts and annual board plan.
- Induction workshop with, at least, our chair and CEO covering: board charter and policies including code of conduct and interests register, overview of netball in NZ, strategy, key partners, financial situation.
- Team new member with a buddy for support during meetings and a sounding board between meetings.





How to Introduce 7 v 7 to players

TIP 1:

Provide opportunities for players to experience a variety of positions. They don't need to specialise yet.

TIP 2:

Let players play and enjoy themselves. We can't predict adulthood success from childhood success so develop the love for Netball first.

TIP 3:

Create a positive environment that focuses on development to get the best out of the players.

Options for introducing 7 v 7

- Run a taster session at your School/ Club/ Centre of the 7 v 7 game.
- Run a Fun Day for parents and players, give everyone a go at the game.
- $\cdot~$ Run 3 week pre/ post season sessions of 7 v 7
- $\cdot~$ Give players and parents the flyer of 7 v 7 Netball
- \cdot $\,$ Have 2-3 sessions on all areas of the court, try out some
- · games/ activities for those areas e.g. Week 1- GA, GS
- \cdot $\,$ Set it up as part of Term 1 holiday programme for Year 7s $\,$
- $\cdot~$ Buddy a Year 7 with a Year 8 to introduce the rules

Creating Year 7 & 8 Teams without Trials

These options will give you an idea of physical skills, knowledge, motivation, coach-ability and teamwork skills of players. Fun and Friends are most important to this age group.

- Invite all Year 7 & 8 players and run a range of small sided games
 e.g. (Ball Tag, Touch Down, Treasure, Fives)
- Have a Fun Day at your School/ Club
- Run weekly sessions with the coaches to introduce players to different areas of the court (Attack, Defence Midcourt)
- $\cdot ~$ If players want to form a team with their friends that's okay.
- Teach the NetballSmart Warm-Up to see fundamental movement skills
- · Run a specific session for those new to Netball

Netball Rodney: Taster for Coach & Netball Smart Workshops

Netball Northern Zone Amelia and Tania led a fun engaging session for participants who took part in the Information Day at Rodney Netball Centre.

The session highlighted the significance of learning through play. By simulating game scenarios, the activities aimed to teach vital skills in a context that mirrors actual gameplay. This approach to learning is both effective and enjoyable, as it helps in retaining new skills because they're practiced in a game-relevant setting.

Moreover, the emphasis on adapting activities to suit varying skill levels and motivations addresses a crucial aspect of coaching—keeping players engaged and challenged. This not only aids in skill development but also in fostering a problem-solving mindset among players, enhancing their game intelligence.

In addition to the practical skills, the session also covered the importance of warm-ups and cool-downs, highlighting their role in player performance and recovery. We touched on why we do what we do and how important that we all have a good experience.

The positive feedback, characterized by laughter and active participation, suggests the session was a resounding success. The follow-up survey indicates a forward-thinking approach, aiming to tailor future workshops to the specific needs of coaches and centres.







Tournament planning at Mangonui Netball Centre

A small group of dedicated coaches from Mangonui Netball Centre attended a Tournament Planning Workshop, in preparation for the upcoming Representative Netball Season.

The core focus areas included strategies to enrich player's experience, both on and off the court, which is crucial for building team morale and individual confidence.

Coaches were equipped with insights on the importance of optimizing physical and mental preparedness, a balanced approach that acknowledges the demands of netball tournaments on our players.

Additionally, discussions took place on key planning, processes, and considerations, to create well-thought-out successful tournament campaign.

The atmosphere of authentic sharing and caring created an enriching experience, where coaches could exchange ideas, challenges, and strategies, fostering a community of learning and mutual support.

The commitment demonstrated by these coaches in attending the workshop underscores their dedication to their netball community.

Paving a new pathway for Māori and Pasifika Netball Coaches



Hitting the netball courts on a Saturday morning is a tradition shared by many kiwi whānau. From the early rises and hustle to get out the door, to the post game team chants signalling a game well played, this sport has been a unifying force bonding communities across generations.

For years Māori and Pasifika players have dominated the courts showcasing their talent and aptitude in the game of netball. They represent their regions in national competitions and have risen to international acclaim as Silver Ferns. When it comes to the people coaching in the higher echelons of the sport, however, there's a sizeable drop in numbers. Healthy Families Waitākere Systems Innovator, Ruta Tonumaivao explains.

"To make the jump from community coach to performance coaching, you must complete an accreditation programme run by Netball New Zealand. The insights we've gathered from community coaches have highlighted the need for experienced Māori and Pasifika facilitators, and to introduce culturally appropriate methodologies into the programme".

Healthy Families Waitākere has partnered with Netball Northern Zone and Netball New Zealand to trial a new approach using te ao Māori principles in the accreditation programme.

"One of the biggest changes we've made to the programme has been to explore a tuakana-teina approach, which focuses on building solid connections within the programme and drawing on the coaches' skills and experience to support and mentor each other", says Tonumaivao.

Te ao Māori principles such as whakawhanaungatanga, manaakitanga, and practising karakia and mihimihi have also been woven into the programme to nurture a space for open, honest communication. Netball Northern Zone Coach Lead, Tania Heap explains.

"Implementing whakawhanaungatanga helped to create a sense of belonging and a safe space to share experiences and work together. In doing so, it strengthened the resolve of each member of the roopu."

"The element of care and authenticity supported the coaches to thrive", adds Leigh Gibbs, Community Coaching Manager Netball New Zealand.

"The programme has been transformative, we've never seen anything like it", says Rob Wright, High Performance Coach Lead Netball Northern Zone.


Rules Workshops

These modules cover a wide range of topics, including Player Centered Coaching, Attack, Defence, Building Effective Relationships, Developing Physical Capacity and so much more, aimed at fostering a holistic approach to coaching and physical literacy.

The emphasis on 'how to coach' rather than just 'what to coach' underscores the importance of developing effective coaching strategies that make a real difference in players' development and team dynamics.

NNZ CCA Level 1 weekend at Howick Pakuranga Netball Centre

Twenty enthusiastic coaches gathered at Howick Pakuranga Netball Centre to attend the Netball New Zealand Community Coach Award Level 1 Weekend. The workshop, facilitated by Kylee Long and Denise Haulter, was filled with laughter, learning, and the sharing of coaching practices. The atmosphere was described by attendees as incredibly supportive, fostering a safe space for the exchange of ideas, learning, and personal development.

Participants were unanimous in their praise for the workshop's holistic approach to coaching. It wasn't just about drills and game tactics; the weekend was a deep dive into how to empower and instil confidence in players, a crucial aspect of coaching. The practical components of the workshop were particularly highlighted, providing the coaches with hands-on experience that is invaluable in their growth and development.

By the conclusion of the weekend, coaches left feeling more confident in their abilities, armed with new strategies and insights to begin the season ahead.

As a result of this weekend, 10 coaches proudly completed the NNZ Community Coach Award with a further 7 just needing to complete the online component to achieve this.

The NNZ Community Coach Awards serves as a cornerstone for ensuring that coaches are well-equipped with the knowledge, techniques, and ethos to nurture and develop players, making a substantial impact on the community and the future of netball in New Zealand.



Northern Zone – Coach Squad : Game Analysis Worksop:

A small cohort of The Northern Zone Coach Squad attended a Game Analysis workshop focused on an ANZ preseason match between the MG Mystics and the Stars which offered a unique insight into the workings of netball coaching strategies. Participants learned about key statistics that coaches prioritize during game analysis, such as scoring efficiency off gains/turnovers, consistency in scoring from the team's centre pass, and the effectiveness of feeds into the circle. These metrics are crucial for evaluating team performance and identifying areas for enhancement.

The workshop also emphasized the significance of simplicity and positivity in coaching. The "less is more" principle highlighted the benefits of providing one or two clear directions during quarter breaks instead of overwhelming players with information.

This approach helps maintain focus and encourages players to replicate positive actions. Monitoring player compliance with instructions and adapting communication strategies when necessary were key takeaways for effective coaching.

Listening to team talks during breaks and interacting directly with the coaches of the MG Mystics and Stars provided valuable insights. Each coach shared their objectives, tactics, and decision-making rationale, offering a rare glimpse into the strategic planning that drives team management.

This experience not only deepened understanding of netball from statistical and tactical perspectives but also highlighted the human aspect of coaching. The generosity of those who shared their expertise and allowed access to the inner workings of the ANZ Netball League was greatly appreciated and left a lasting impact, creating an unforgettable learning opportunity for all participants.

Witnessing the high level of netball skills up close was truly mind-blowing.







National Tipu Series - Selfcare



Our roles can be overwhelmingly demanding, making the need for self-care not just a luxury but a necessity. This session emphasized that self-care is inherently personal to each individual, it requires self-responsibility and to practice it, in a deliberate and holistic manner.

The workshop delved into the essence of self-care, highlighting that it must be practiced with selfawareness and initiated before reaching a point of crisis. This pre-emptive approach challenges the misconception that self-care is a reactive or quick fix to stress or burnout. Instead, it is a continuous process that encompasses various dimensions of one's life, including taha tinana/physical health, taha hinengaro/emotional well-being, taha wairua/ spiritual wellbeing and taha whānau/family & social wellbeing. The series made it clear that understanding and attending to personal needs in a thoughtful, consistent way is not only an act of self-preservation but also an act of self-respect.

Perhaps the most powerful takeaway from the Tipu Series was the affirmation that "You are worth it." This simple statement serves as a reminder that the value of self-care is recognition of our worth as individuals. By fostering an environment where self-care is seen as essential and unique to each person, the series not only provided practical strategies for well-being but also celebrated the diversity of needs and experiences within the group. Embracing self-care is not a sign of weakness; rather, it is a testament to the strength and self-respect necessary to thrive in our challenging roles.


