## COACH

#### MYSTIC PLAYERS - Prepped and Ready to Roll to deliver the NNZ futureFERNS and PDP

It was an absolute delight to collaborate with the Mystic Players on the NNZ futureFERNS and PDP Programmes.

We took extra care and time to look at the benefits of the modified games and activities for each age group and why we do what we do in this space.

All credit to the Mystic Players who demonstrated a clear understanding behind the philosophy of the futureFERNS & PDP (Year 7/8 Player Development Program). They shared that it's all about creating a great experience for our younger players, so we have a lifetime of netball players and in doing so create healthier communities.

They identified that the overall skill levels grow as the players develop through the years (a little bit like reading, you wouldn't give a 5-year-old a Harry Potter Book). They discussed the advantages of learning how to play defence and attack positions, and less players on the court meant more touches of the ball and more involvement in the game.

They thoughtfully acknowledged that little humans would find a big court overwhelming, and trying to teach players the role of each position can be time consuming, resulting in more talking and less doing.

But most of all they agreed that it is all about fun, fun, fun at all ages!!!!

During the session the players then got the opportunity to role play being 5- & 6-year old's (note I would highly recommend them applying for a job on Shortland Street).

They took turns delivering the activities and game. This proved to be most entertaining as well as educational.

Our Mystic Players have proven to be great ambassadors for our sport and fully embrace the NNZ futureFERNS and PDP Philosophy.

#### **Community Coach Observation Workshop**



On a wet windy morning, in the car bound for The Trust Stadium, we met up with community coaches who were determined, to learn as much as they could from observing a Northern Mystics training session.

An invitation to observe a Mystics Training was sent out in February to Netball Northern Coach Developers and Centres to forward on to their coaches, and as numbers were capped it was first in, first served. Within a day all the places had been taken and as the saying goes 'The early bird gets the worm'; or in this case 'a seat on a bench observing the Mystics training'.

Tia Winikerei, Head Coach, along with her team were very accommodating, sharing how, and why they do what they do, providing an insight into the different roles of the management team, and importantly the workload and expectations of the players.

We observed a Team Building Fun Game at the beginning, the NetballSmart Warm Up in action, some speed testing, then skill activities followed by Through court and Centre Pass on attack and defence.

## **UMPIRES**

#### Whangarei Netball Centre – Umpire Training Sessions



Whangarei Netball Centre are trialling fitness sessions for umpires with a focus on NetballSmart, learning how to run a Yoyo, and the body stance and running positions needed for umpires.

This is a fantastic initiative which hopefully will encourage umpires to build their fitness and technique. Whangarei aims to build umpire numbers through the season, and getting umpires together where the focus is just for them will help build a team network of peer support.

It's great to see umpires encouraged to make fitness part of their normal training process. Those that wish to develop further will gain experience running the testing.

There are not many opportunities to build teamwork amongst our umpires as they mostly have at least 2 hats: Player, umpire, umpire coach, and sometimes even our young ones have coaching responsibilities as well.

These sessions are just one way for us to try to build some team spirit and peer support.

#### **Introduction to Umpire Coaching**

The Introduction to Umpire Coaching module is the first step on the coaching journey and the foundation on which umpire coaching is based. It is aimed at new umpire coaches, or umpire coaches who would like to refresh or better understand the principles of coaching. The module includes philosophies that underpin how we coach.

#### Introduction to Umpire Coaching (ITUC) Dates

Northern Zone have planned three Introduction to Umpire Coaching (ITUC) workshops so far for this year. Two will be face to face workshops (3 hours) and one online (two sessions of 1 ½ hours).

Auckland Netball Centre ran an Introduction to Umpiring course at the end of February. This was open to new umpires keen to learn more about umpiring! NetballSmart also attended to help educate new aspiring umpires on nutrition, hydration, recovery and the importance of staying injury free as an umpire.

Highlights included taking the participants through a mass warm-up which we can't wait to see when it comes to game day!

Howick Pakuranga have been running a player preparation programme over the last 4 weeks. This includes some on court conditioning, body weight strengthening and fitness. We know that there is a large spike in injuries in April/May and preparing well helps to reduce that injury risk. It's not too late to prepare well!
