We have all been working hard to arrest the financial difficulties we were having. We have been successful with several applications to funders, and this along with the various fundraising and cost cutting activities we have undertaken should mean we will be in a much better position come year end. We continue to apply for funds and will continue to look for costs savings as we run through to the financial year end of 30 November 2019. The Board has now set our 2020 Zone Affiliation Fees. As per our previously applied principle, the Zone fees will only be adjusted by the current Consumer Price Index (CPI) of just over 1%. The fee structure is attached for your reference, and I note that this includes the Netball New Zealand fee information previously advised to you directly by Netball New Zealand.
