BACKGROUND

Papakura Netball Centre has at present a membership of 198 teams affiliated to the domestic competition (Saturday netball), which equates to approximately 2000 players, 200 Coaches and 200 Umpires for the 2021 season. In addition to the domestic competition we deliver the largest Counties Manukau Secondary Schools competition with a membership of 89 teams, 26 schools, and over 1800 additional members, deliver multiple school tournaments, and offer coach, player and umpire development pathways.

The last 4 years has seen growth in the services delivered to our community e.g. ANZ FutureFERNS Netball programme and Te Puawai Netball Leadership in Schools programmes, which has enabled netball to be taught to newcomers of the game and part of the school curriculum in over 16 local schools.

Our vision is that our community and individuals are enriched through netball experiences. We aim to provide a supportive and safe environment with a focus on ensuring that all members have the best experience in sport. Develop a lifelong love of community netball and a love for being physically active. Play is a crucial part of physical, cognitive, social/emotional, and spiritual development for all.

- Introduction of new initiatives with community partners; Kura Connect, Oranga Wahine, Oranga Whanau Health Expo, Lion Nathan Young Enterprise Scheme
- State of the art facilities to support the playing, umpiring, coaching and mentoring of our netball community. 20x rubberized courts with access to Pulman Arena.

- An environment for personal growth in netball, through establishment of player, coach and officials pathways
- Current Winter Club Competition membership of 2000 players, 200 Coaches, 200

- Approximately 3000 visitors weekly in season
